Nietzsche famously said that he would believe in the Redeemer when the Christians looked a little more redeemed. Fair enough: let us live in such a way that all may know that we have been redeemed— living each day in freedom and joy. Formerly we lived like everyone else, helpless and trembling in the shadow of death, debtors to sin in the lands of Assyria and Egypt. But no longer. Now we are going home, our faces radiant with Pascha, the faces of those who have heard the blast of the Jubilee trumpet. Let that trumpet sound in the ears of the weary world, loud enough to wake the dead: Christ is risen! —Fr. L. Farley

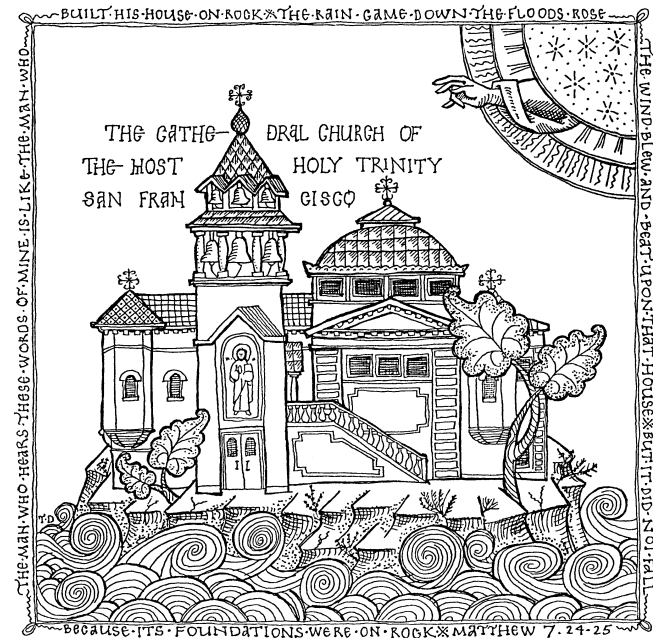
Fr. Kirill will be out of town Monday & Tuesday

Today's Apostolic Reading

Acts 5:12-20

In those days, many signs and wonders were done among the people by the hands of the Apostles. And with one accord they all would meet in Solomon's portico; but of the rest, no one dared to associate with them, yet the people held them in high honor. And the multitude of men and women who believed in the Lord increased still more, so that they even carried the sick into the streets, and laid them on beds and pallets, that at least the shadow of Peter passing by might fall on some of them. And there came also multitudes from the towns near Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed.

But the high priest rose up and all who were with him, that is, the party of the Sadducees, and being filled with jealousy seized the Apostles and put them in the common prison. But during the night the angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out and said, "Go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this Life."

Gospel Reading

John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.

So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples therefore said to him, "We have seen the Lord."

So he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe."

And after eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, "Peace to you!" Then He said to Thomas, "Reach your finger here, and look at My hands; and reach your hand here, and put it into My side. Do not be unbelieving, but believing."

And Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

Suggestions for the Paschal Season

Let us not forget that we are in a battle for our spiritual lives; we exercise and feed the soul. Otherwise doubts arise and cannot be answered. Read Scripture in light of how you came to believe in Jesus Christ. Read the Scriptures right after praying, so you will read in a prayerful frame of mind. Secondly, never remove yourself from the Holy Mystery of the Eucharist: it is union with Christ, with the Holy Orthodox Church, and union with one another—we are not isolated individuals, but human beings called together to be one in Christ. -Fr.
